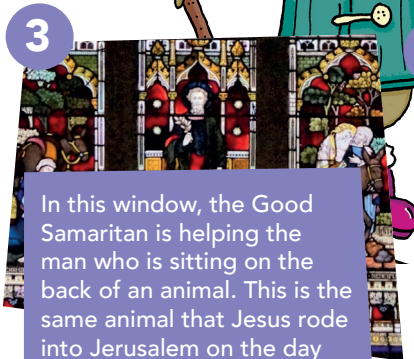
USE THE MAP OVERLEAF TO HELP YOU FIND THE ANIMALS!



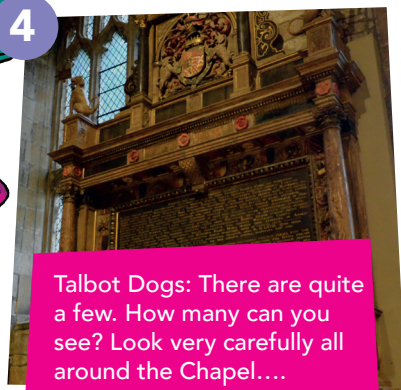
1 Look up, very high up and behind you. Which two animals can you see?



2 The Pulpit has many animals carved into it. Can you find one which is traditionally associated with Spring?



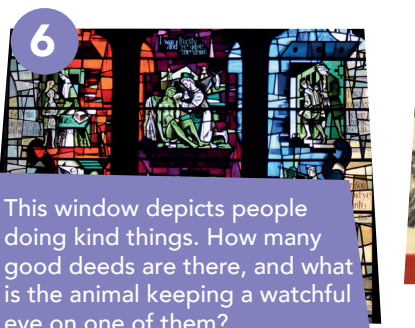

4 Talbot Dogs: There are quite a few. How many can you see? Look very carefully all around the Chapel....



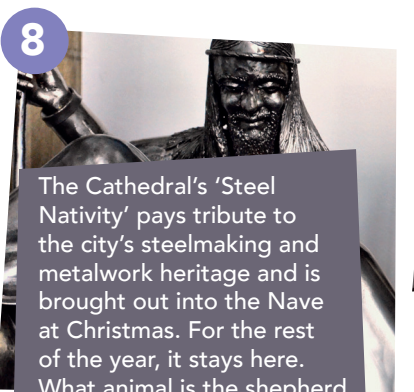
5 Find St John's pew. What type of bird has been carved into his seat?



6 This window depicts people doing kind things. How many good deeds are there, and what is the animal keeping a watchful eye on one of them?



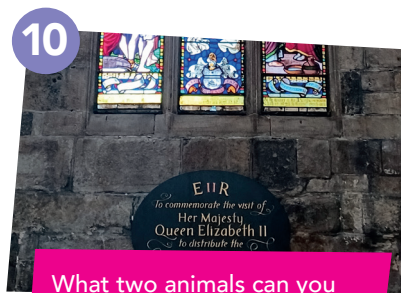
7 Find the picture of 'The Last Supper' in the Chapel of the Holy Spirit. How many people can you see in the drawing sat with Jesus.



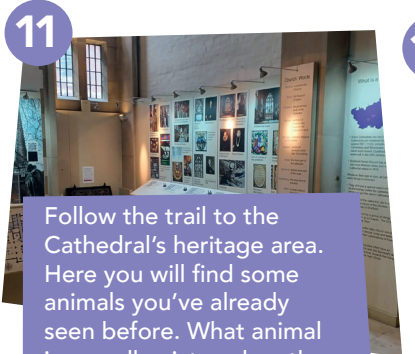

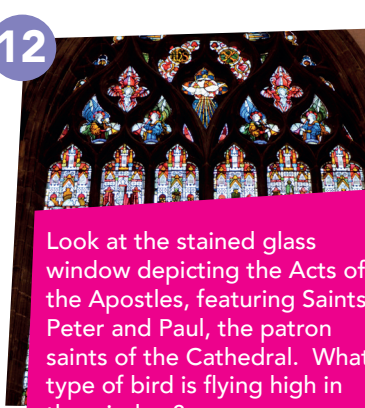
9 Can you find the animal in St George's Chapel who likes cold weather? What is it?



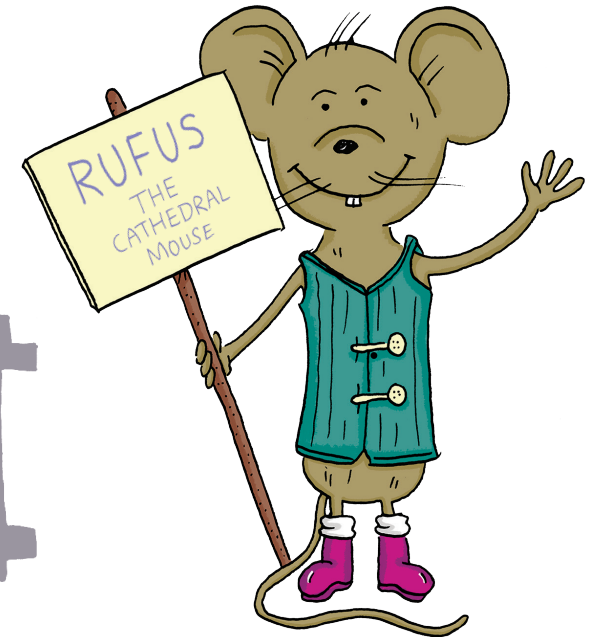
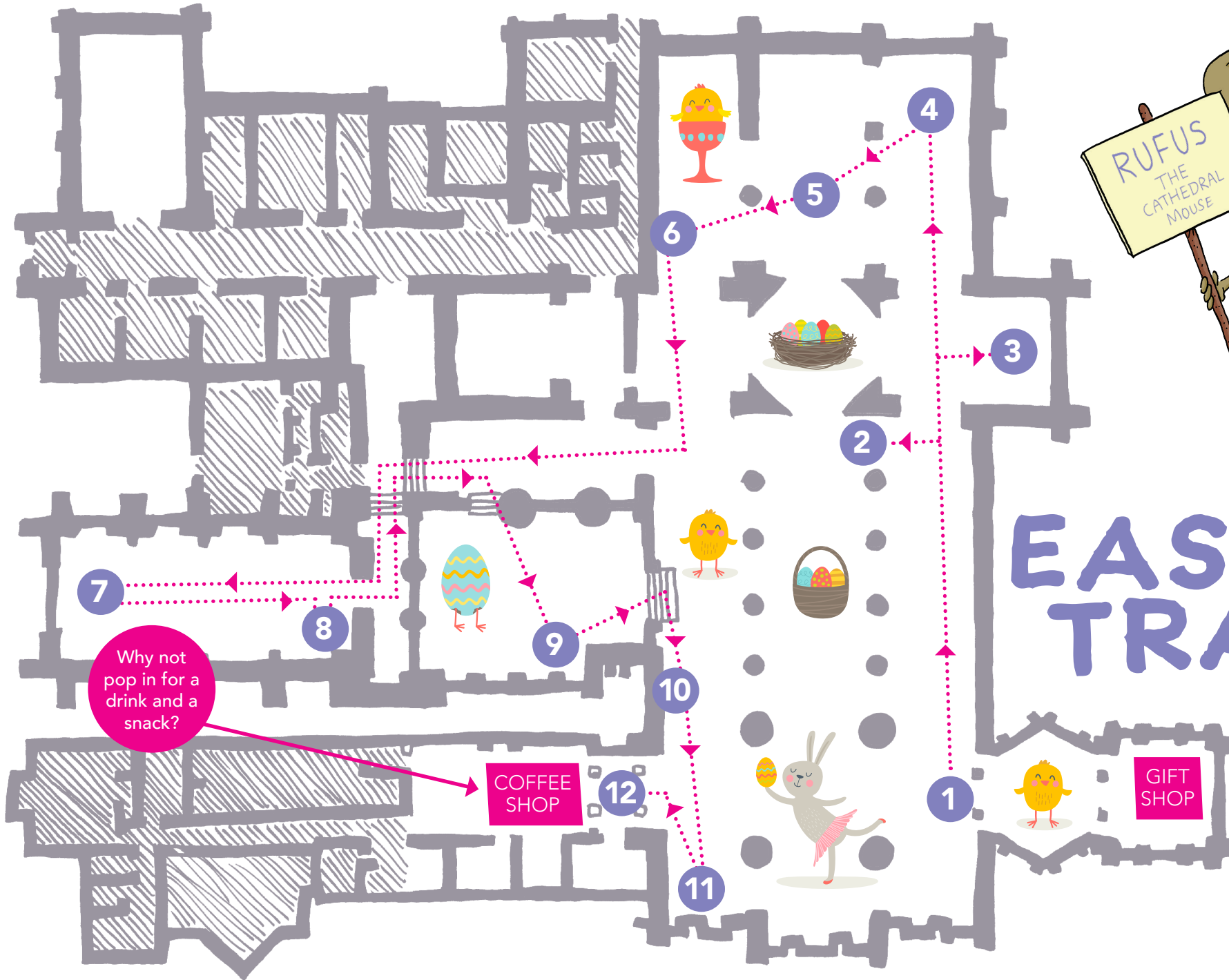
10 What two animals can you see in the stained glass window above the Maundy Thursday plaque in the Nave?
