Music during the service

In this service the Cathedral Choir are joined by the Choir of Rotherham Minster. The introit is *Oculi Omnium*, by Charles Wood, 1866-1926. The responses are sung to a setting by William Smith, 1603-1645. The Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis are the setting in B Flat by Charles Villiers Stanford, 1852-1924, and the anthem this lovely evening is *God is Gone Up* by Gerald Finzi, 1901-1956.

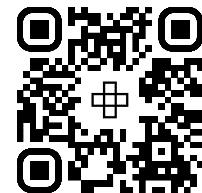

We understand that it is the responsibility of each one of us to protect children, young people and adults from physical, emotional and sexual abuse, and from neglect. Together we can build a community where everyone can flourish.
